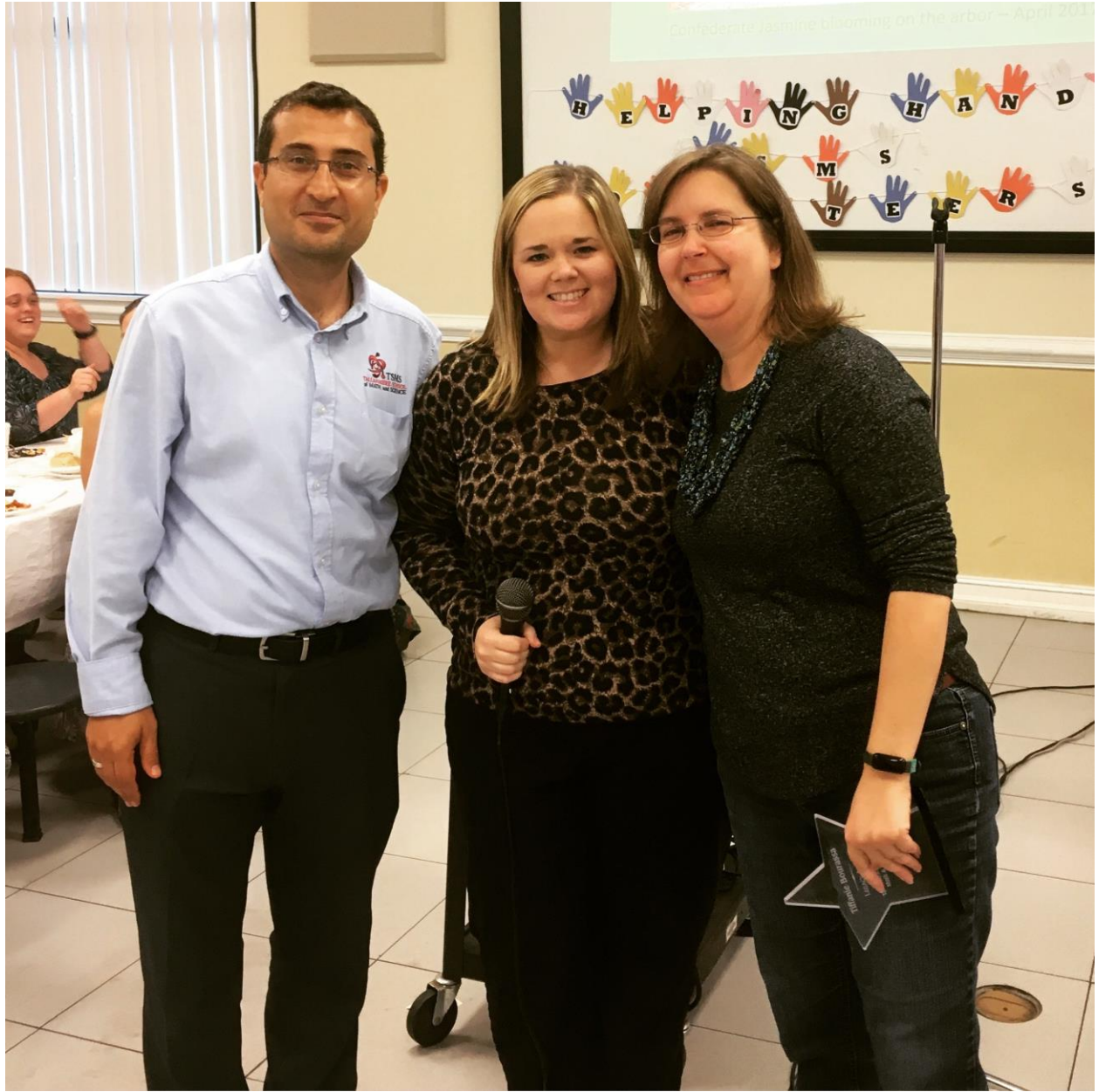

EGG HANDLING AND STORAGE TIPS

- Keep eggs refrigerated at 40°F or lower until you use them.
- Be sure your hands, utensils and countertops are clean before preparing any food.
- Cook eggs until the white is set and the yolk is firm.
- Keep hot foods hot (above 140°F) and cold foods cold (below 40°F).

















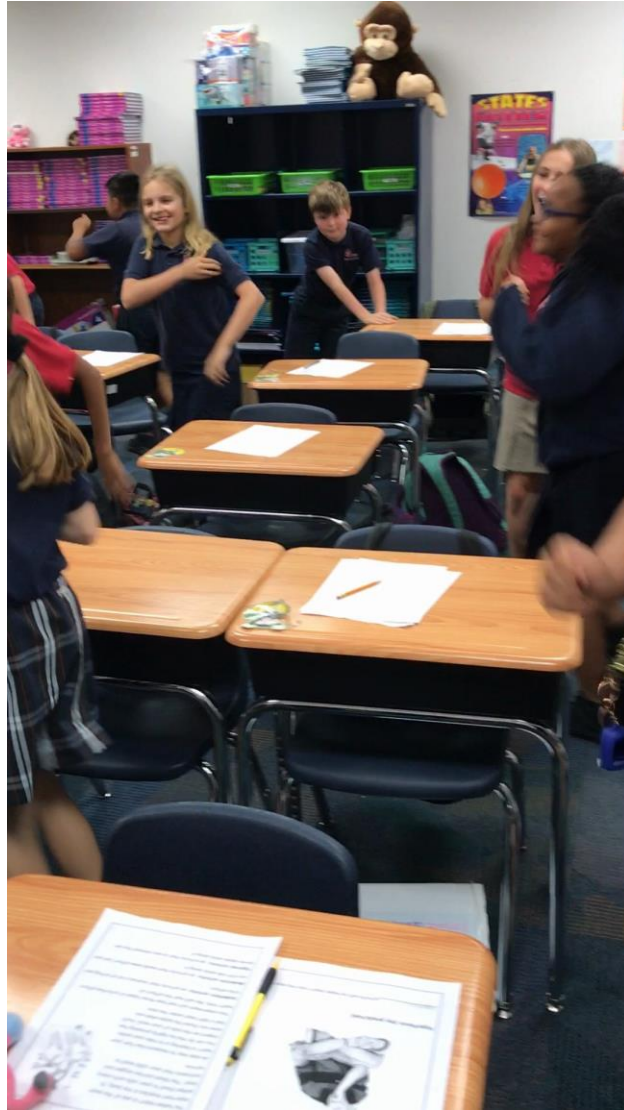

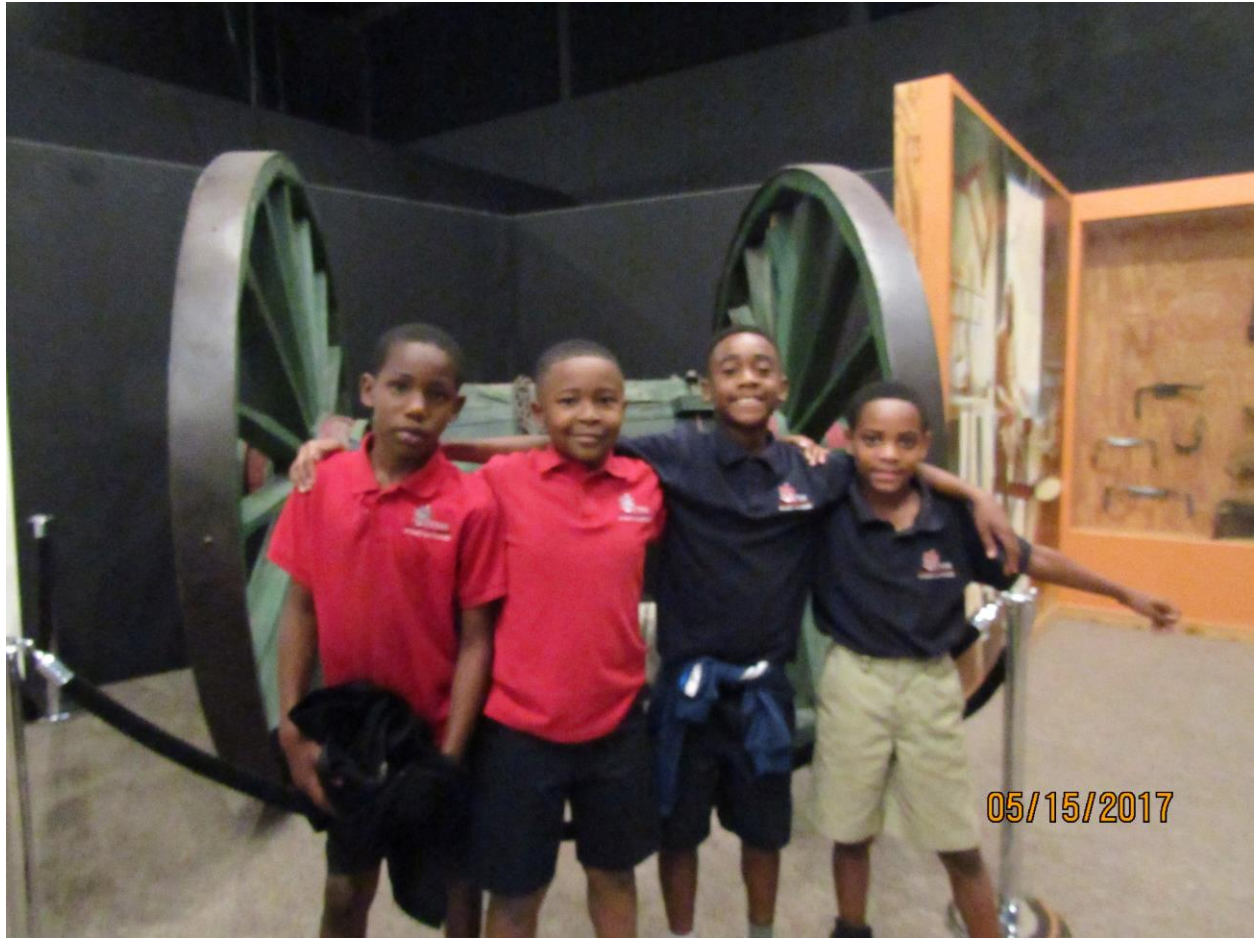

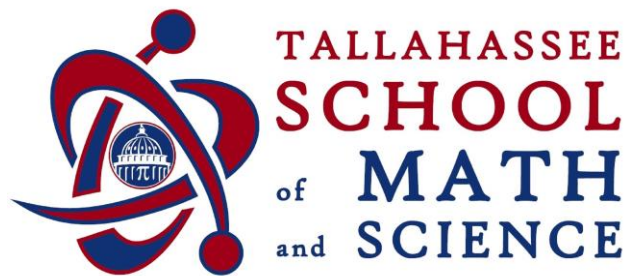
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
